THIS EVALUATION MEETING IS ORGANIZED WITHIN THE TCP (TRAINING AND COOPERATION PLAN) AND IN CLOSE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE NATIONAL AGENCIES OF PORTUGAL, FINLAND, DENMARK, IRELAND, NORWAY, SWEDEN AND BELGIUM (FRENCH SPEAKING PART).

## **OBJECTIVES**

Reaching the end of the YiA Programme, this evaluation meeting/seminar intends to gather experienced promoters to make together an impact assessment of the use of youth exchanges on the young people involved, as well as the local communities affected by these exchanges.

- Share good and bad practices in relation to youth exchanges (=YE)
- Evaluate the impact of YE strategies on the involved young people
- Evaluate the impact and involvement on local community through implementation of YE
- Evaluate the compatibility of other YiA actions combined with the strategic use of YE
- Evaluate how YE have promoted European citizenship-awareness for young people and local communities involved
- Create an online document with summary of the findings and recommendations

#### HOSTING IN A RURAL VILLAGE

This **"WHASSUP WITH YOU"** will take place in a rural village in the centre of Portugal, 'Vila da Marmeleira', which has 460 habitants. Over the past 3 years, different international activities (including YiA projects) have been implemented in this community, offering a win-win situation for all involved, local development and a learning for local people through their involvement in the activities, besides the deep and authentic intercultural experience for the participants.



Next to the pedagogical outcomes of the international activities (e.g.

training course, seminar, workcamp), the different projects have left their mark on the community. A local impact and international footprint have been left behind and are currently giving concrete results. At this moment in time, a group of young people between the ages of



13 & 16 has applied for the hosting of a youth exchange in August 2013, after a self-organized preparation period of 8 months to complete the application form. There is an increased entrepreneurship and enthusiasm measurable in the community. A local movement PartInRio has been created in the village as outcome of an Action 5.1 organised by the city Rio Maior, gathering local decision makers and young people in a common movement to increase participative democracy.

The village lies in the middle of Ribatejo, a region known for bullfights and wine. Even though it is 'only' 80 km from Lisbon, this rural area has recently suffered a lot under the unemployment wave. Many people depend of unpredictable seasonal labour and public transport is so limited that social isolation is an easy consequence, not only for older people, but mostly for young people living in the village. Many men have left their families behind and work abroad, spending few weeks a year with their families ... back to the times of the sailor men, and the origin of the melancholic music Fado. These projects intend to re-vive the community and to promote values as solidarity, cooperation, partnerships and entrepreneurship.

We believe this village can serve as an example of how international projects (including YiA) can have a broader 'return' for the investment made. It also shows how projects involve complete communities in a long term strategy where non formal learning is not only applied upon participants, but is implemented upon a whole community at the same time. We believe strongly in a common win-win situation ... because it is possible!
