# About

Drop-In is a training (TC) of youth workers and teachers who want to improve and support the learning process of potential school dropouts. The TC is designed to discover various reasons why youngsters disconnect from school, to experience different ways of learning, to reinforce synergies between formal and non-formal education and to share and learn tools, methods and best practices from different international perspectives.

### Context

There are many reasons why some young people give up education and training prematurely. This might lead to several negative sideeffects such as frustration, mistrust in themselves and in institutions, social exclusion, unemployment, poverty and poor health and in extreme cases criminality and radicalization.

To support the learning process of these youngsters efficiently and to stimulate their motivation in education, both teachers and youth workers need new educational methods, strategies and approaches: more comprehensive and learner centred. These should help to create the right environment, in order to stimulate and facilitate young people in articulating their own hopes, goals, dreams and ways of learning.

# What can you get out of the project?

- Better understanding of the phenomenon of school drop-outs and lack of motivation in education.
- Better recognition of the role of the different main stakeholders (e.g. teacher, family, youth worker, etc.) in the learning process of the youngsters.
- Better understanding how formal and nonformal education can reinforce each other.
- New perspectives, understanding and learnings from the intercultural and European differences in relation to potential school drop-outs.
- New tools and methods to support learning processes of youngsters.

#### **Exploring together**

Together we take accountability for the outcomes and the groups wellbeing. We learn and share from and with each other.

#### **Diversity of methods**

We take different learning styles into account and make use of the knowledge and (intercultural) differences within the group.

#### **Experiential learning**

We believe in learning by doing as an important learning style. That means not only theory, but also doing activities and learn from them.
